

**"ADVENTURES IN HISTORY" SUMMER CAMP
COLONIAL PERIOD AND THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION**

Thomas Penn once said, "Every man in Cumberland County is a rioter at heart." Come explore the role of these "rioters" in early settlement and the American Revolution. Campers will explore the challenges of colonial life in a "cow pie" hunt, baking homemade bread and churning butter, starting a fire with flint and steel, making paper, and spinning wool. Loyalists will be put in stocks and there will be a black powder rifle demonstration, bullet making, and a symbolic effigy of King George to get us in the mood for revolution. A large selection of period clothing will provide the opportunity for **all** campers to suit up as frontier folk, trades people, politicians, farmers, and soldiers.
