The following document is a thorough version of the current finding aid, with documents being given a more detailed title, description of their contents, and provided page amounts and ranges as it compares to the scans folder. All materials appear in the order as presented in the current folder configuration, and more detailed information, more precise dates (with methodologies included), and the number of pages scanned being supplied. As certain sub-records contain multiple individual entries, these items have also been described, and their corresponding ranges provided (which are given in parentheses). Personal research has also assigned dates to items previously left undated.
