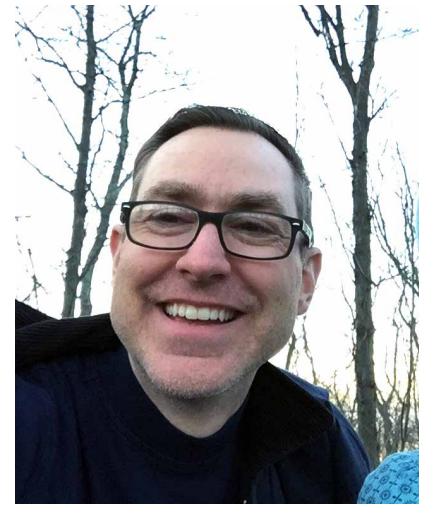


# looking back, looking forward

It's usually not exciting or apropos to mention yearly financial audits during opening addresses or words of introduction such as these. However, at this writing, I am thrilled to report to our community and CCHS supporters a very significant discovery revealed during 2016's audit, conducted by Smith, Elliot Kerns and Co.

*We recently learned that in 2016 the Cumberland County Historical Society allocated 73% of its financial resources directly to programming. Yes, 73 cents of every dollar spent was allocated to programming. Programming in this context refers to lectures, tours, conferences, festivals, publications, research, community outreach, story-telling, collections interpretation and *staffing directly dedicated to these important efforts*. There is no doubt that non-profit organizations continually face harsh budgetary challenges in the "new world" we live in. Many (including CCHS) feel the constant pressure to find funds for admin, maintenance, capital improvement and general operating expenses. Yet, despite all these various pressures, we should feel very-proud of this 73% figure because it serves as an indicator that the Society puts history, mission and community engagement at the forefront of all its activities. Many of these activities are high-*

lighted throughout this annual report. Furthermore, we hope that the changes made to our financial review section on page 23 will better inform our members and the community-at-large.

Before closing, I would like to make a sincere appeal for anyone who wishes to confidentially chat with me about planned or legacy giving, to give me a call or reach out to me via email at [jillari@historicalsociety.com](mailto:jillari@historicalsociety.com). Do you have a special project in mind which you might like to fund? Are you considering a multi-year pledge but need help to set this up? # Library

It was a busy year for the Hamilton Library. Staff and volunteers have been busy helping the patrons who visit the library, accessioning and cataloging new materials, and answering research requests. We have answered over 100 research requests from researchers all over the country. We have worked with students from local high schools, Dickinson College, Messiah College, Shippensburg University, and York College. The rare books housed in the bookcase in the library have been added to the PastPerfect catalog. Previously, the books had been cataloged only into the old card catalog. Many of these books were published locally. We plan to create a bibliography of these books available online.

The library started a National History Day Collection to add digital copies of the local history themed projects done by Cumberland County students which place in their respective categories at their schools. We look forward to seeing this collection grow in future years.

Archives & Library manager, Cara Curtis, spoke at the Scottish Society of Central Pennsylvania's annual meeting. She also spoke about the Carlisle Journeys conference on Good Day PA and genealogy research on WITF's Smart Talk. She and Deborah Sweaney continued their genealogy workshops in 2016.

The Elizabeth V. and George F. Gardner Digital Library has seen continued growth in 2016 since it

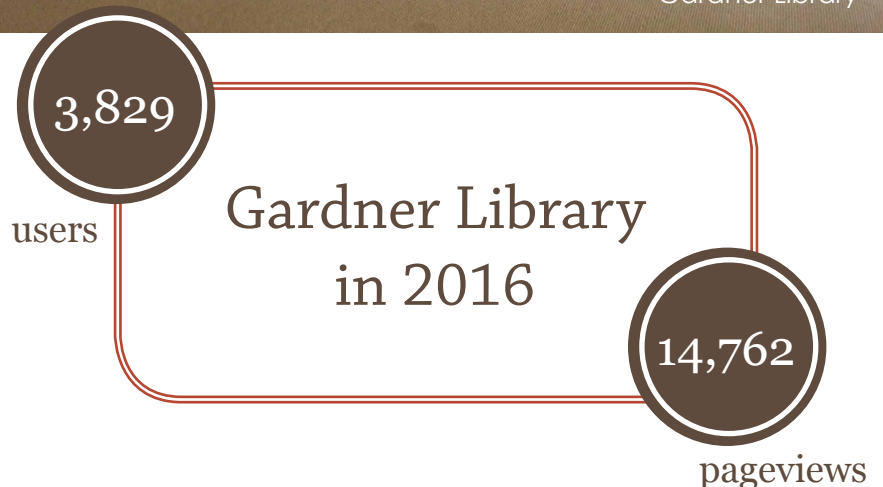
formally launched in May 2016. Through the project over 100 individuals have shared their story and contributed to the historical record of Cumberland County. There are currently over 140 entries in the encyclopedia portion which are now augmented by the Society's old Journal articles up to 2011. The Gardner project continues to be a

digital repository highlighting not only the history of the County but also the excellent work produced by CCHS.

The library staff could not accomplish all the work we do without the help of our wonderful and dedicated volunteers. We are incredibly thankful for the help that they provide.

# Photo Archives

The year 2016 was a record year for the Photo Archives. We had a total of 55 accessions, but our collection at least tripled in size due to the number of huge collections that were given to CCHS. Massive collections include the lifetime collection of Jim Bradley, *The Sentinel's* negatives from 1990-2010, and the photo archives of Allenberry Playhouse that encompasses 65 years. Other large donations dramatically increased the number of images in our collection related to Mechanicsburg, the Camp Hill area, Walnut Bottom, Mt. Holly Springs, and county fire companies. We also purchased what is likely the only known image (daguerreotype) of Gen. John Armstrong, Sr.

The huge number of new accessions created a critical need for additional storage and processing space, as well as more staff time and volunteers to process the new accessions. A new "Bradley Room" was created in part of the former Educational Center, thanks to the generosity of Jim and Mary Bradley. Several new volunteers were recruited and some library volunteers have also been helping process photo collections.

Photo sales also increased in 2016. 62 orders brought in nearly \$8,000 income for CCHS. We also provided images for Society speakers, programs and exhibits. Our largest order was for Roaring Brook Press for a new children's book about Jim Thorpe.

For several years we have been making an effort to name unidentified people who appear in some of our 20<sup>th</sup> century photos. Rob

Schwartz has maintained an exhibit of selected unidentified *Sentinel* photos. In 2016 Blair Williams, under the auspices of the Gardner Project, organized a more programmed effort to have groups of "seniors" work with large numbers of unidentified photos. This has resulted in the identification of hundreds of individuals found in our photos.

The Photo Archives is managed by Richard Tritt, Robert Schwartz and Blair Williams with the assistance of about 15 volunteers who help us on a weekly basis. Thank you to all our dedicated and talented volunteers, as well as to all who donated a record number of images in 2016.

# Museum

2016's major exhibit used everything from Beatles records to kitchenware to Kennedy campaign posters to celebrate a decade now 50 years in the past. *The 1960s* was sponsored in honor of Jim and Helen Scott and put together with the help of many folks who loaned items or helped install the exhibit. Over 2,000 visitors attended this and our related holiday exhibit *Grin with the Grinch*, which was based on 1960s holiday specials.

Intern Madison Baric poured many hours into research on many Cumberland County women who made samplers. This research is featured in the 2017-2018 exhibit *Trends & Thread: Women, Family and Society in 19<sup>th</sup> Century Samplers*. We appreciate the sponsorship and items loaned to

this exhibit by the Charles and Tandy Hersh Family.

Groups that shared exhibits with us this year were Gannett Fleming, celebrating 100 years of engineering projects in Cumberland County, and Greater Carlisle Heart & Soul's focus on community storytelling. Our design work in 2016 included the new book *Carlisle Car Shows*, as well as the yearly journal, annual report, strategic plan, and assorted postcards and flyers. The museum had 58 donations of artifacts this year and we are continuing to collect funds to conserve artifacts in our "Save yOur Stuff" exhibit. Thank you to the CCHS staff, museum committee, docents and other volunteers whose time and work are all a part of the museum.

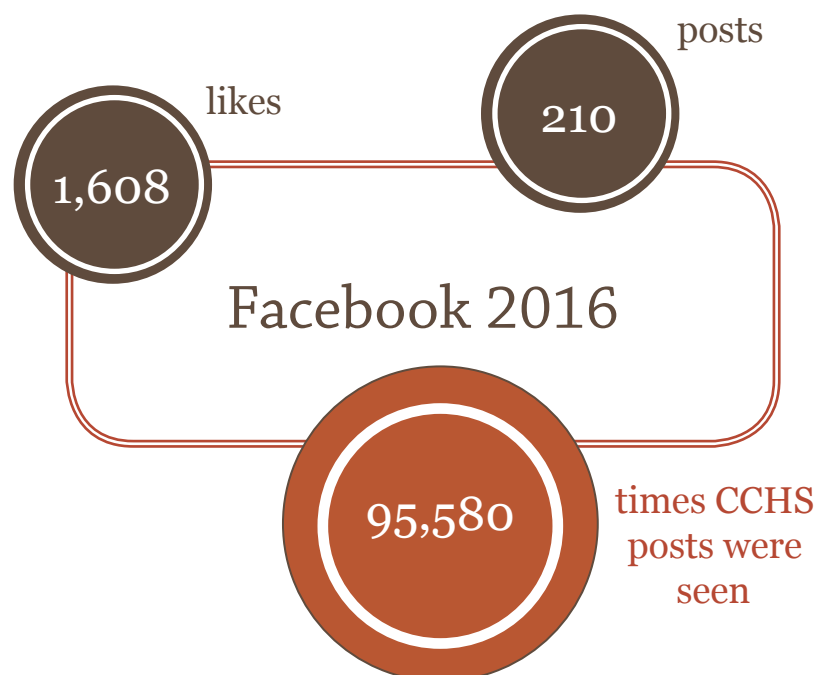

In 2016 the Cumberland County Historical Society had 1,654 people attend programs/events.

In conjunction with the 1960s Exhibit at the Cumberland County Historical Society, we hosted a new program, the Richard C. Reed Architectural Lecture. This lecture was generously supported by Society member Maureen Reed and her family. There were over 100 people that attended the talk by Architectural historian Wendy Pires on “Mid-Century, Middle

Class and Modern: 1960s Home Styles and Neighborhood Trends in Carlisle.” Also, we provided a bus tour that focused on 15 buildings that represented an architectural style that was popular during that era, mid-century modern.

This year Randy Watts and Jane Black each created a new walking tour for the Society. Randy did “One Block, 300 Years of Cumberland County History” and Jane did “Connections.”

Throughout the year, the Society hosted numerous talks, special events, bus trips, and a variety of walking tours. There were 141 people that attended the Annual Dinner. This year our guest speaker was Cooper Wingert, who discussed his book *Slavery and the Underground Railroad in South Central Pennsylvania*. We finished 2016 with over 175 children and adults participating in the Holiday Family Fun Program.

Looking ahead to 2017 we are publishing a new book written by Paul Hoch on the Carlisle Car Shows, and an exhibit catalog on Trends & Thread.

In 2017 History on High - the Shop will continue to schedule interesting demonstrations by special guests during local special events. We will be involved with both the Genealogy Workshop and American Craft Week in October.





# Carlisle Journeys

Thank you to all the members and friends who supported the *Carlisle Journeys* conference last October. We were pleased with the turnout for the second of the biennial series, titled “Celebrating the American Indian Sports Legacy.” This CCHS initiative continues to fulfill our mission to bring together visitors from across the county, country, members, descendants of Carlisle Indian School students, nationally recognized speakers and presenters, college students and CCHS staff in an effort to explore the issues tied to the American Indian boarding school era. The October 7-9, 2016, two-day events were attended by 175

registrants, speakers and volunteers, some traveling from as far away as New Mexico, California, New York, Massachusetts, Virginia, New Hampshire, West Virginia, Kentucky, Michigan, Canada and the United Kingdom. A film crew from Wake Forest University in North Carolina chronicled the two days of speeches, presentations and panel discussions. We were pleased to be able to offer the sports expertise of Dr. John Bloom, Neal Powless (Onondaga film producer), author and *Washington Post* columnist Sally Jenkins, and Jim Thorpe biographer Kate Buford. The keynote speaker, Olympic Gold Medalist Billy Mills

(Oglala Lakota) enthralled the audience with his personal story about endurance. There was a sensitive panel discussion by Ray Halbritter (Oneida) and Amanda Blackhorse (Dine) explaining the controversies surrounding the use of racial slurs in sports. A highlight of the events was a talk by Coach Sid Jamieson (Cayuga) explaining the origins of lacrosse in his talk “More Than A Game.” We look forward to the third installment of the *Carlisle Journeys* series, which will commemorate the centennial of the closing of the Carlisle Indian School in October 2018.



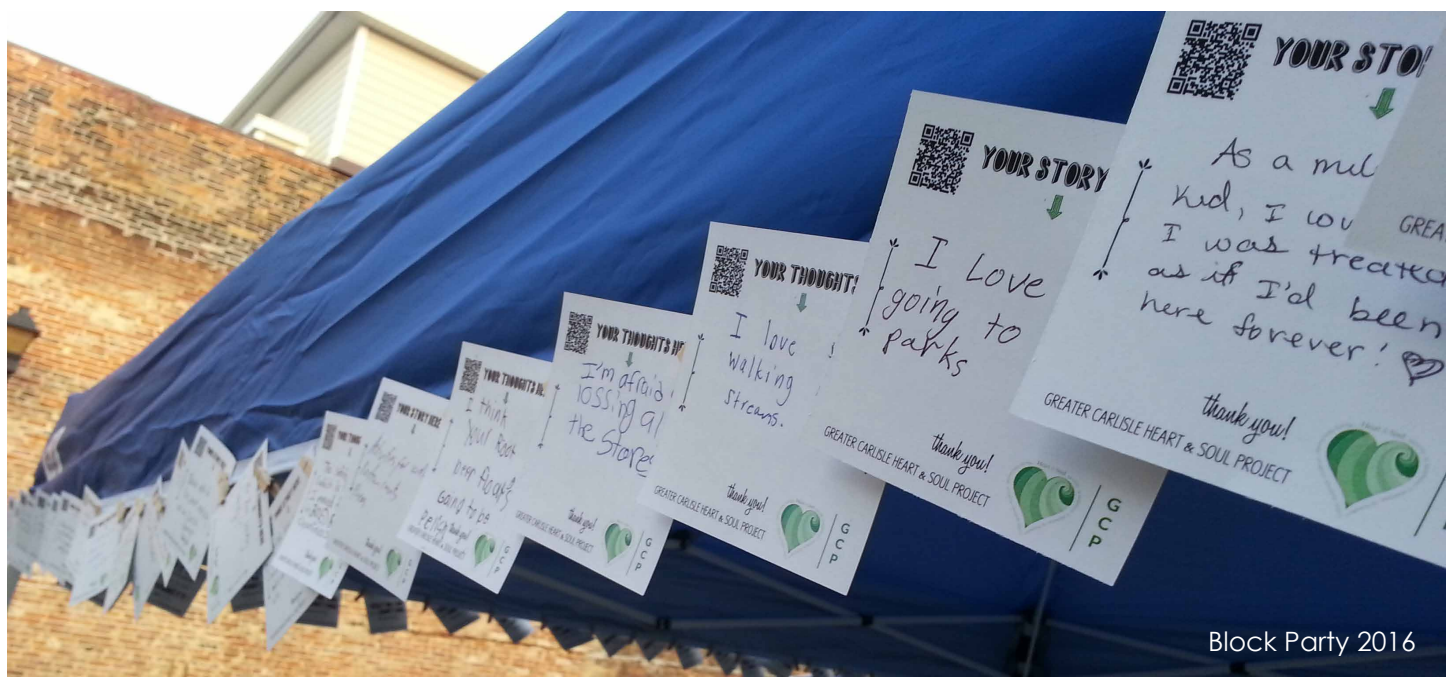
# Heart & Soul

In 2016, Cumberland County Historical Society became the fiscal sponsor for Greater Carlisle's Heart & Soul initiative. This project is funded by the Pennsylvania Humanities Council and South Mountain Partnership and uses the Orton Family Foundation framework, which requires communities to collect stories to understand community values and take action on those values. Under the direction of Dr. Lindsay Varner, Heart & Soul collected over 700 audio, video, written and drawn stories from individuals living, working and playing in Greater Carlisle. Each of these stories tells us what's important, including family, parks, agriculture, regional landscape, history, architecture, and vibrant downtowns; in other words, our culture and heritage.

Heart & Soul goes beyond collecting and archiving histories and stories, we are a community devel-

opment project, intended to create action within communities from the stories we collect. For example, from a story collected in May 2016 we embarked on a project to preserve the memory of Mount Tabor Church and Cemetery in Mount Holly Springs. With help from the United Way, Ahold, Mount Holly Paper Mill and the Greater Carlisle Community we have started the process of preserving the memory of the church's congregation and protecting the cemetery and those laid to rest there. In addition, we developed the first annual Heritage Days in which the values shared through your stories are enjoyed by the community. On September 10, we offered free tours of the Mount Holly Marsh Preserve, Allen Road Rails to Trails, and Mt Tabor Church. We also developed a cycling tour of Greater Carlisle following the Civil War and Underground Railroad sites in the region.

# Historic Properties

My first year as the Historic Properties Coordinator has been challenging but fruitful. We addressed numerous pressing maintenance issues at all three of our facilities. The Two Mile House held its 23rd Annual McLain Festival with 1,751 attendees and over \$17,000 raised. Finally, we generated over \$9,500 in revenue from historic properties rentals.

Last year, after assessing our buildings, I set forth a number of maintenance goals such as the repair of several HVAC units at 21 North Pitt Street, the reconstruction of the collapsing gable at 33 West High Street, and the installation of new chimney flashing at the Two Mile House. I'm pleased to report that these maintenance tasks have been completed. In addition, the portico at 21 North Pitt was repainted and a new awning was installed. Our tenant at 33 West High Street

received numerous repairs and upgrades. Further, the roof at the Two Mile House was repainted, new shutters installed, the windows reglazed, the garage sill and door replaced, and a new butterfly garden was constructed as part of an Eagle Scout Project. In 2017, we will work with our historic properties committee to develop a comprehensive plan to address our most urgent facilities maintenance projects by 2020.

Over the coming years, I would also like to see an emphasis placed on energy efficiency with regards to the replacement and repair of HVAC, water, and lighting infrastructure. It should be our collective goal to see CCHS become a leader and model for preservation in Cumberland County. In the long term this will help preserve our county's architectural and landscape history.

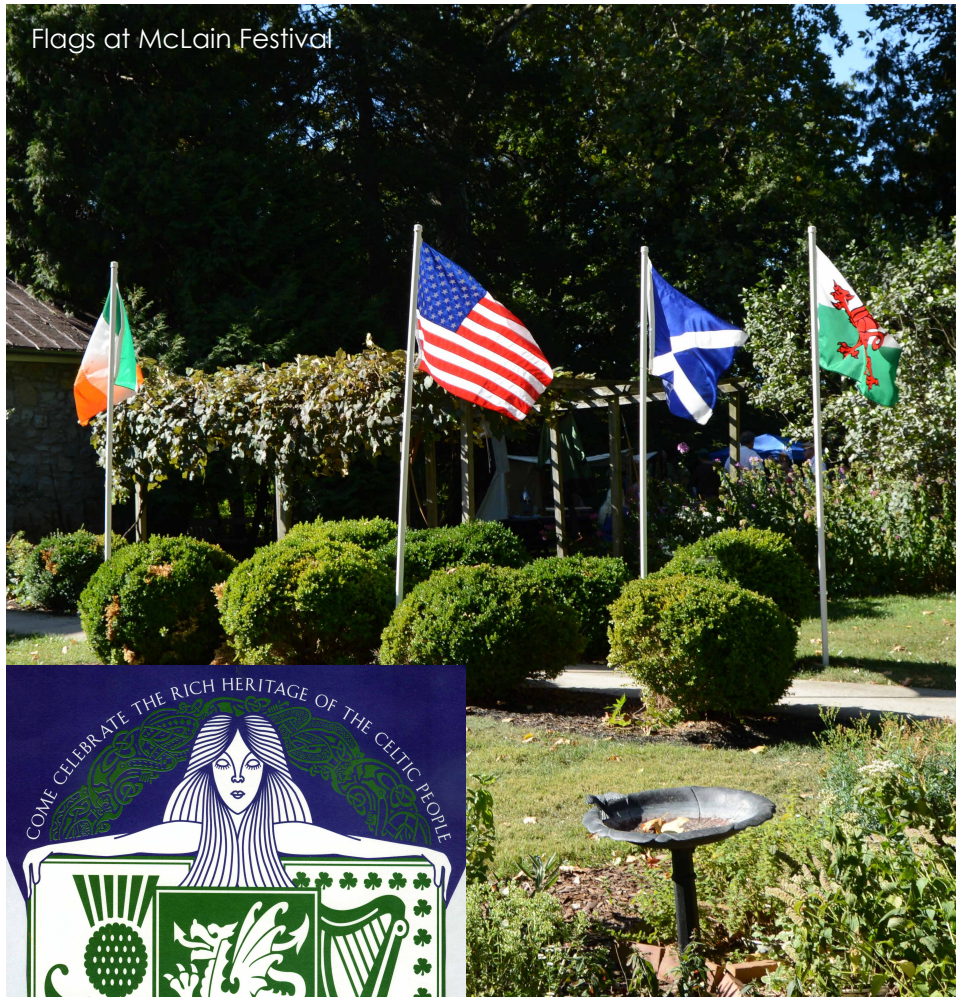

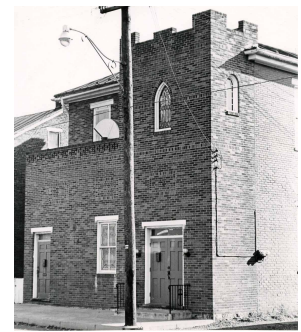

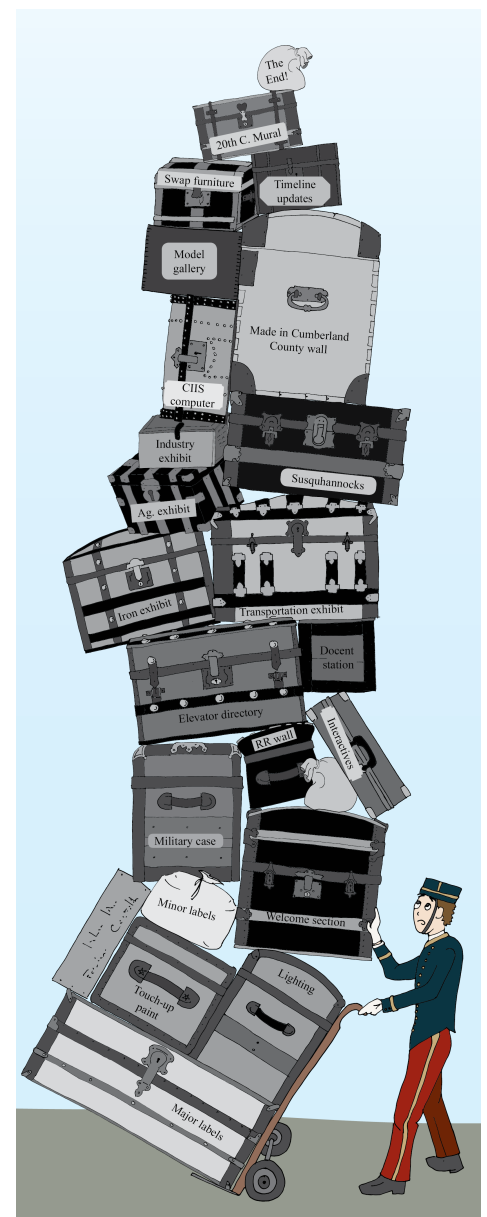
### Gardner Library Wins PA Award

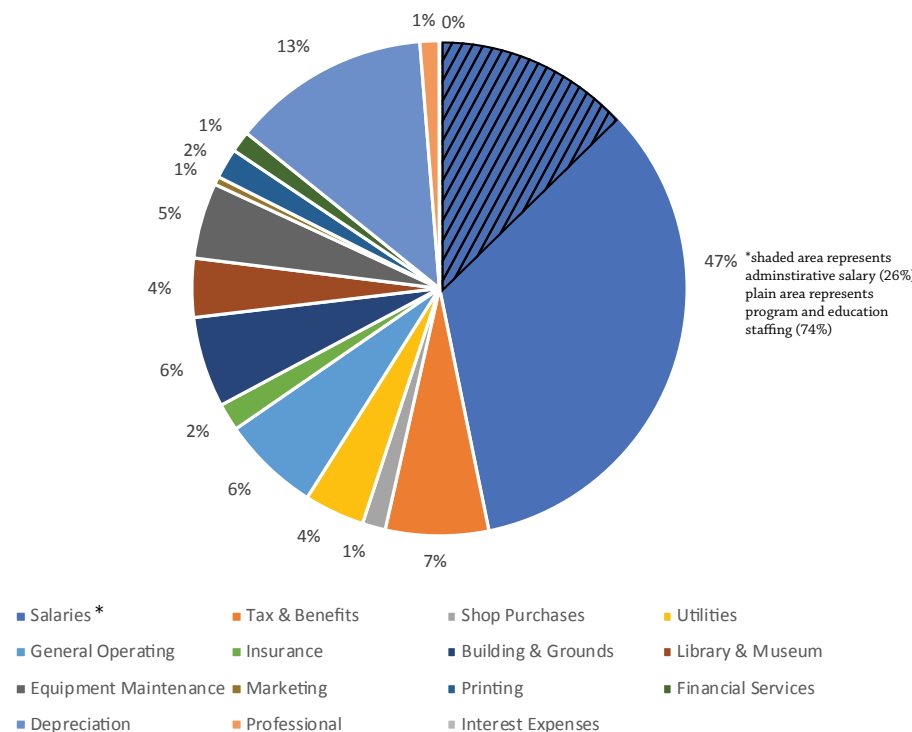

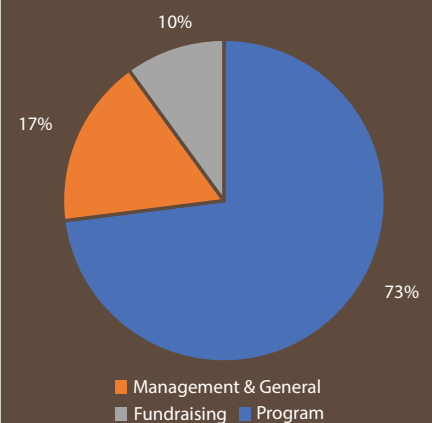
