Abstract

These journals record official orders and correspondence issued by the headquarters of the Cavalry Depot, Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania, during the period between 20 December 1855 and 24 October 1866.

Historical Note

During the period covered by these journals, Carlisle Barracks served as the focal point for the recruitment, training, and deployment of mounted service troops for the US Army. In his capacity as Superintendent of the Mounted Recruiting Service, the Commander of the Carlisle Barracks Cavalry Depot led recruitment throughout the mid-Atlantic region under the direction of the US Army's Adjutant General.

Collection Description

The large, leather bound journals contain paginated, hand written entries are in generally good condition though there is some fading of the script. Underlining of words and a few marginal comments indicate the records were later reviewed.

A detailed description and a listing of contents follows for each of the two journals.

Notes for the User:

Names. Both journals in this collection contain hundreds of names included in entries made by numerous different individuals. A best effort has been made to determine the correct or at least most likely spelling

of the names and in some cases possible alternatives are included in brackets. The user is nonetheless cautioned to use several alternative spellings when searching the document and where possible to consult the original.

Abbreviations. Unless otherwise indicated, each listing includes the full names and titles of correspondents and associated organizations the first time they appear, but subsequently, and particularly for those that appear repeatedly, only the last name and in some cases the position held and the abbreviation of the organization.

Military Ranks. For the most part, the ranks of the personnel cited are omitted for brevity. Users should refer to the original listing for these details.

Spellings. Current common usage is used in place of the nineteenth century spellings of things and place names, e.g. sergeant for serjeant, sabers for sabres, and Pittsburgh for Pittsburg, etc.

Attachments to Correspondence. Many entries cite transmittal of official reports from the Depot, namely the monthly Post Return, Superintendent's Report, Monthly Enlistments, Muster Rolls, and personnel accounts. In no cases are these documents present with the journals. Users seeking these documents are directed to the US Army Adjutant General records in the National Archives.

"Special Orders, Cavalry Post, Carlisle Barracks 23 December 1855 - 24 October 1866."

This handwritten 478-page journal contains the "special orders" dated, numbered, and signed by or attributed to the Post Commander and/or his adjutant. "Special orders" generally are defined as those that direct actions by individual personnel rather than by the post overall. The personnel actions recorded In this document include promotions or appointments, reductions in rank, reassignments, official travel, and leave. Recurrent orders posted also direct the periodic convening of officer boards for Garrison Court Martial duty or to review recruitment actions ("Board of Inspectors"), post finances, and military stores, etc. ("Council of Administration" or "Board of Survey"). In a few cases, the special orders direct depotwide inspections or restrictions. Although the format of the orders is generally consistent, the level of detail contained in the entries varies. For example, some include the names of recruits whose cases were reviewed by a Board of Inspectors, but most do not. Similarly, most entries for a Garrison Court Martial list only the date to convene, while others include the names of individuals tried and occasionally the trial results. Additionally, there are a few findings included for the Boards of Survey that include the status of depot horses and supplies.

Collectively, the special orders provide insight into the US Army Mounted Service recruitment activities at the Carlisle Depot during the period 1856 to 1866 and the refocusing of the US Army Mounted Service from support of troop deployments in the American West to augmentation and deployment of personnel for action during the American Civil War. The user also will note the inclusion of orders for troops from the depot to respond to the invasion of Pennsylvania by Confederate troops in 1863 and again in 1864, the use of depot facilities for convalescence of wounded personnel, and the participation of depot personnel in taking groups of deserters and stragglers to the Provost Marshal in Harrisburg. Although covering the time period when the Carlisle Barracks were burned by Confederate troops, the orders make no mention of actions taken at that time. Red commentary in the margins, indicate, however, that the entries probably were made in Harrisburg, to which barracks personnel evacuated.

The following listing of orders arranged by page number and date consists of a brief summary of the action directed and the names of person(s) mentioned. For brevity and to avoid unnecessary duplication, the list does not include the name of the commander or his adjutant issuing the individual orders, or the associated transportation authorizations that accompany most orders involving travel. Although some citations of rank, position and unit affiliation are included, particularly for entries during the period of the Civil War, the user should consult the original document for such details. A separate chronological listing

of post commanders and adjutants during the time covered by the records is appended to this finding aide.

Users of this listing will note that the designations of regiments cited change over time. By an act of August 3, 1861 (12 Stat. 289), the 1st and 2d Dragoons, the Mounted Riflemen, and the 1st and 2d Cavalry were re-designated 1st-5th Cavalry Regiments, respectively; and the old 3d Cavalry became the new 6th Cavalry.

Records, Cavalry Post

This journal records the official correspondence of the Headquarters, Cavalry Depot, Carlisle Barracks between 20 December 1855 and 26 July 1862. During this timeframe, the Commander of Carlisle Barracks served concurrently as the Superintendent, Mounted Recruiting Service, US Army. As such he led not only training and equipping of personnel at Carlisle for dragoon and cavalry units, but organized recruitment activities ("Recruiting Rendezvouses") in New York City and Albany in New York; Baltimore and Cumberland in Maryland; Pittsburgh and Philadelphia in Pennsylvania; Cincinnati in Ohio; Richmond in Virginia; and New Orleans in Louisiana.

The correspondence, signed either by the Commander or his Adjutant, comprises:

—Transmittal letters for reports {"returns"}, accounting and personnel actions sent to the headquarters of major US Army personnel and support related departments. In some cases these 'cover' letters cite persons mentioned in the reports, but in no cases are the actual reports present.

—Reports to higher headquarters about Mounted Service recruits being sent from Carlisle Barracks. These reports cite the number of recruits—buglers, in particular—being sent and usually name the officers leading the detachments. Of particular note are reports highlighting the augmentation of US Army dragoon and cavalry units at cavalry posts as far west as California; the reinforcement of the US arsenal at Harpers Ferry, Virginia; and the reinforcement of artillery batteries protecting Washington D.C.

—Communications between the Commander and his field recruiting officers. While many of these letters simply record personnel transfers, leave requests, or accounting, some provide insights into the challenges recruiters faced in finding 'sound' men of the right age and height to meet the army's needs. The exchanges also document the shift in recruitment activities, to include closure of stations, as the events leading up to the American Civil War unfolded.

—Letters detailing efforts by the Commander to maintain the facilities of the Carlisle Barracks, find equipment and horses needed for training, respond to unforeseen events like fires on the post, and work with Carlisle civilian authorities to resolve clashes between Barracks personnel and local residents.

Informs the AG he has directed the men to report to Major General Benjamin F. Butler, U.S. Volunteers at Boston, Massachusetts. 612. 26 Nov 1861. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re furnishing horses of the post for drilling a Volunteer Company in the vicinity. Action taken in compliance with a telegram from W.J. Palmer to the Secretary of War. Notes that several hundred public horses in the neighborhood of Harrisburg might be

used "should this Company remain any length of time encamped here."

613. 29 Nov 1861. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re authority to send Lieutenants A. Pleasonton and I.R. Dunkelberger of the 1st Cavalry to join a squadron of that regiment recently arrived from California. Notes that there are more officers (8) than necessary for the ordinary duties of the depot. Suggests the propriety of authorizing him to send officers from time to time who may be no longer needed {at the depot} to join their companies or regiments when not in remote departments.

613. 29 Nov 1861. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re whether he should discharge private John S. Perley, Jr. of the Permanent Party. Notes that the Governor of New Hampshire has commissioned Perley a Second Lieutenant in a regiment of Volunteer Cavalry.

614. 1 Dec 1861. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of the Post Return for November. 614. 2 Dec 1861. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of Muster and Descriptive Roll of two buglers transferred to Gibbon's battery, 4th Artillery as directed. Notes the "boys are only partially instructed in the different calls."

615. 2 Dec 1861. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of summary statement of funds received and disbursed on accounts of recruiting service during November.

615. 7 Dec 1861. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re authority to discharge "for worthlessness" two men —Private George H. Cook of Company C, 5th Cavalry, and Private Dennis Cooney of the Mounted Recruiting Service—in confinement at the depot for desertion. Notes that Cook is charged with having deserted twice.

616. 8 Dec 1861. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re requirement for blank forms.

616. 9 Dec 1861. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of Muster and Descriptive roll of two buglers transferred as ordered to Ricketts Battery, 1st Artillery.

617. 9 Dec 1861. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re acknowledgement of permission to muster Robert M. McClure into service as Major of the 4th Regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers. "this regiment had been previously organized as one of the Reserve Corps authorized by an act of the Legislature of the State and when it was presented to me to be mustered into the service of the United States I took it for granted the officers had been duly appointed by the Governor. I did not see their commissions. My opinion is that in many cases the officers of Pennsylvania Regiments were not commissioned until after their arrival at the seat of War. Major McClure was legally mustered into service and I have not doubt he is justly entitled to hold the position."

617. 19 Dec 1861. Hastings, D.H. to Royall, Capt. W.B., Commanding Company C, 5th Cavalry, Camp Clifford, Washington, D.C. Re desertion on 14 December of Private George H. Cook of Company C. 618. 23 Dec 1861. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of charges against privates Dennis Cooney and Edward Hamilton of the depot and request that a General Court Martial be ordered for their trial. Lists officers available for duty: Hastings; Rodenbough; Tarleton; James R. Kemble, 3rd Cavalry; John A. Shulze, 1st Cavalry; Frank Stanwood, 3rd Cavalry; and Rodney Fisher, 1st Cavalry. Suggests Tarleton as Judge Advocate.

618. 1 Jan 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of the Post Return for December. 619. 3 Jan 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of the Muster rolls for troops at the post for November and December.

620. 16 Jan 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Rutherford, Capt. J.P., Assistant Quartermaster, US Army, Harrisburg, Pa. Re transmittal of an invoice of clothing and camp and garrison equipage sent to him with clothing he had ordered for Camp Cameron while Mustering Officer in Harrisburg. Notes that clothing is to be reshipped to Rutherford's address and that receipts should be sent to Military Store Keeper, Philadelphia.

620. 16 Jan 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Long, Capt. E., Commanding Company K, 4th Cavalry, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. Re Private Thomas Doran of his company who reported to the depot on furlough. Notes advisability of his remaining at the post until an opportunity arises to join his company.

621. 1 Feb 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of the Post Return for January. 621. 3 Feb 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of Muster and Descriptive Rolls of Privates Seneca Larke and Thomas H. Pritchard of the band of the 1st Cavalry transferred to their regiment as directed.

622. 3 Feb 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Officer Commanding 1st Cavalry, Washington, D.C. Re transfer to him, as directed, of privates Seneca Larke and Thomas Pritchard.

622. 3 Feb 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Chambliss, Capt. W.P., Company D, 5th Cavalry, Camp Cliffburne, Washington, D.C. Re transmittal of descriptive account of pay and clothing of private William House of his

company as requested.

623. 6 Feb 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re a second request that the application of J.A. Shulze, 1st Cavalry, on temporary duty at Carlisle, be granted to rejoin his regiment.

623. 14 Feb 1862 Hastings, D.H. to Crump, George, Secretary to the British Consulate, Philadelphia, Pa. Re his query about obtaining the discharge of George W. States {or Strates?}, a bugler boy at the post. Details re his enlistment and procedures for his discharge. Notes that the "lad appears well satisfied with his position."

624. 15 Feb 1862. Hasting. D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re a request that Fredrick C. Ogden be ordered to Carlisle from Fort Leavenworth, Kansas for the purpose of instruction. Notes that Ogden would not be able to join his company in New Mexico before May or June.

624. 19 Feb 1862. Hastings, D.H to Carlisle, Capt. J.H., 2d Artillery, Commanding Battery E., Camp Duncan, D.C. Re transmittal, as requested, of a descriptive list and account of pay and clothing of Private Melville O. West of his company.

625. 25 Feb 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re obtaining books. Marked as Not Satisfied. 625. 1 Mar 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of the Post Return for February. 626. 3 Mar 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of Muster Roll of troops at the post for January and February.

626. 3 Mar 1862. Hastings, D.H. to VanNess, Col. E., Deputy Paymaster General US Army, Baltimore, Md. Re transmittal of Muster Roll for January and February.

627. 14 Mar 1862. Hastings, D.H. to the Commanding Officer, Company A, 5th Cavalry, Washington, D.C. Re obtaining data for charges against George Pirola, who said he was a deserter from Company A. Notes that Pirola was apprehended at Indianapolis, Indiana about 25 February and was now in confinement at the Carlisle Barracks.

627. 20 Mar 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Meigs, M.C., Quartermaster General, Washington, D.C. Re transmittal of an inspection report of worn out property pertaining to the Quartermaster Department at the post. Requests instructions as to its final disposition.

628. 1 Apr 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of the Post Return for March. 628. 22 Apr 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. "Captain MKnights {or McKnights?}Battery, 5th Artillery is at Fort Monroe, has never been here. Captain Chalfin's Battery (formerly D.E. Hart's) is here with three Officers and ninety seven men; its guns are arriving from Harrisburg. The Quarter Master there has invited proposals to furnish it with horses, and unless special authority is given to purchase them the Battery cannot be ready for the field in less than a month."

629. 22 Apr 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re status of and obtaining horses for Capt. Chalfin's Battery, 5th Artillery. {See above.} Notes that Chalfin has two subalterns and ninety seven enlisted men and is recruiting. Expects the company to reach its manning before horses can be delivered by the last of May. Suggests purchasing the horses.

629. 25 Apr1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of a report of the Board of inspectors and Surgeons Certificates of disability in cases of rejected recruits of the 5th Artillery: William Fisher, Felder {Hendersmer?}, Phillip Stockert, and James Stalling.

630. 2 May 1862 Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of the Post Return for April. 630. 3 May 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of the Muster rolls of the troops at the post for March and April.

631. 6 May 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of the report of the Board of Inspectors and Surgeons Certificates of disability in the case of rejected recruits of the 5th Artillery. 631. 9 May 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re obtaining any General Orders published since No.13 of 11 February 1862, the last received at the post.

632. 17 May 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of Muster and Descriptive Rolls of a detachment of recruits assigned to Company L, 5th Artillery, at the post in the process of organization. 632. 18 May 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of the report of the Board of Inspectors and a Surgeons Certificate of disability in the case of recruit John Kerwin of Company L, 5th Artillery.

633. 20 May 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re remission of the unexpired portion of the sentence of prisoner private William Houselt of the Permanent Company at the depot. Notes the request is based on consideration of good conduct of the prisoner.

633. 23 May 1862. Chalfin, S.F., Captain, 5th Artillery to Depont, Lt. H.A., Adjutant, 5th Artillery, Fort Hamilton, N.Y. "I have to report that the discharge papers, consisting of certificate of Disability for

discharge and Proceedings of a board of Inspectors in the case of recruit John Kerwin, enlisted by Lt. Burnham, 5th Artillery, on 15 May, and rejected at this post 17 May were returned to the Commanding officer with the following endorsements, viz.: Respectfully returned. The Department cannot act till this clothing, with prices, is stated. There is no reason that the clothing list should not have been recorded and Lt. Burnham should be reported to his colonel for neglecting to send it." Signed by Thomas M. Vincent, by order of the Secretary of War. Notation that "no account of the clothing issued by Lt. Burnham to recruit Kerwin, has yet been received".

634. 25 May 1862. Chalfin, S.F. Captain 5th Artillery, Commanding to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of a Board of Inspectors and a Surgeons Certificate of disability for discharge in the case of recruit William H. Stewart of the Mounted Service.

634. 26 May 1862. Kemble, J.R., 1st Lt., 3rd Cavalry, Commanding Post, to Beckwith, Capt. E.G., Hagerstown, Md. {Noted as a copy of a telegram.} "We have Garrison stores on hand, for two months. Captain Willson is Commissary and Quartermaster at Harrisburg."

634. 29 May 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re departure of Company L, 5th Artillery, consisting of three officers and ninety-nine enlisted men for Baltimore on 26 May.

637. 19 Jun 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Larned, Col. B.F., Paymaster General US Army, Washington D.C. Re the name of the replacement for the late Col E. Van Ness as chief paymaster of the district and his station.

638. 1 Jul 1862. Hastings, D.H. to Thomas, Lorenzo. Re transmittal of the Post Return for June. 638. 2 Jul 1862. Hastings, D.H. to French, E.B., Second Auditor, Treasury Department, Washington, D.C. Re transmittal of a return of deceased soldiers for the 2d quarter of December 1862. {Also sent to Thomas, Lorenzo.}
